Council announces \$300,000 for the Substation

Hobsons Bay City Council has agreed to commit a further \$300,000 towards the completion of the Substation redevelopment. This much needed funding boost will allow us to undertake major construction tasks. When the work is completed we will be able to fully utilise all areas of the Substation and start using the arts centre on permanent basis.

Hobsons Bay City Council has been a major supporter of the project from it's earliest beginnings and this latest commitment is an endorsement of the hard work put in by our committee and membership. The Councils on-going support for our project is very much appreciated.

A special General meeting of the members of our association is to be held on Monday 16 June 2008 to consider the rule change to allow a non-elected council officer to be a member of the HBCAC Inc. We have been waiting for a response to our Federal Government application for \$365,000 through the Regional Partnerships Program since it was submitted back in July 2007. So far the Federal Government has not contributed anything to our project.

This funding will allow us to complete the redevelopment of the Substation into a vibrant well utilised centre for the visual and performing arts. It will provide many cultural and socio-economic benefits for community groups and the western region.

The ramp is now operational and we had our first person in a wheelchair test it out over the festival weekend. We have received a wonderful contribution of quality pre-used plumbing fixtures and fittings from the Supreme Court that will save us a lot of money.

Williamstown Festival Contemporary Art Prize

The 2008 Williamstown Festival Contemporary Art Prize was officially opened by the Victorian Minister for the Arts - Lynne Kosky, MP, on April 3.

Featuring 87 artists from across Australia, this award is recognised nationally for showcasing innovation and excellence in the visual arts and annually attracts hundreds of high quality entries from across Australia.

Judges were David Hurlston, Curator of Australian Art Exhibitions, National Gallery of Victoria, Geoffrey Ricardo noted Melbourne artist and lecturer, and Donald Williams, arts writer and Director of Global Art Projects.
